

Plastic packaging, cans and beverage cartons

What to throw in?

- Soft drink bottles, water, milk, vinegar etc.
- Squeeze bottles of sauces and oil
- Vials of shampoo, shower gel and detergent
- Packs of cheese, meat and fish
- Cups of yogurt, custard and ice cream
- Bowls of salad, vegetables and fruit
- Pasta-, rice-, bread- and candy bags
- Bowls of butter, sauce and cheese spread
- Plastic bags
- Plastic plant pots
- Blister packs (plastic parts of toothbrush packages, screws, etc.)
- Cardboard packages for fruit juices, water and wine
- Cardboard packages for milk, custard and yogurt
- Cardboard packages for soup and pasta sauce
- Cans
- Drink cans
- Crown bottle caps
- Steel syrup bottles
- Food cans (soup, vegetables, fruit)
- Wax tea lights
- Aluminium foil and trays
- Crisp tubes
- Crisp bags
- Tablet blister packs

What not?

- Small chemical waste, such as nail varnish remover, sealant tubes, or turpentine
- Polystyrene foam from, for example, fast-food packaging
- Full packaging
- Everything that is not household plastic packaging material



Vegetables, fruit and garden waste

What to throw in?

- Potato peels
- Leaves
- Flowers
- Filter bags with coffee ground
- Coffee pads
- Cooked food
- Mowed grass
- Vegetables, fruit and garden waste
- Small pruning waste
- Droppings and straw of small pets (guinea pigs, rabbits)
- Mussel shells
- Nut pods and eggshells
- Weeds
- (Water) plants
- Tea bags
- Compostable bags with seedling logo

What not?

- Ash
- Grass seeds
- Hair (human/animal)
- Wood and scrap wood
- Charcoal
- Matches
- Diapers
- Oasis (is used as a substrate for plants and flower pieces)
- Garbage bags
- Vacuum cleaner bags
- Coral sand
- Sand



Paper and Cardboard

What to throw in?

- Newspapers, magazines and books
- Advertising printing without plastic foil
- Cardboard boxes, such as rice packs
- Writing and drawing paper
- Egg boxes
- Gift wrapping
- Cardboard

What not?

- Beverage cartons
- Dirty or wet paper/cardboard such as filter bags with coffee ground
- Binders and ring binders
- Wallpaper



Textile

What to throw in?

Clothing (also worn out clothing)

- Trousers
- Shirts
- Jackets
- Dresses
- Stockings
- Underwear
- Pyjamas
- Skirts
- Socks
- Ties
- Sweaters
- T-shirts
- Vests
- Swimwear
- Hats
- All kinds of shoes

Bed linen

- Bed linen
- Bedsheets
- Blankets
- Pillowcases

Curtains

- Curtains
- Net curtains

Household textiles

- Towels and washcloths
- Polishes
- Napkins and textiles
- Tablecloths
- Tea towels
- Washcloths
- Home textiles

Bags and accessories

- Belts
- Shawls
- Bags

What not?

- Soiled textile (for example with oil or paint)



Glass

What to throw in?

- Kitchen glass
- Beverage glass
- Bathroom glass
- Vases

Glass with leftovers or with a cap can also be put in the glass bowl.

What not?

- Crystal glass
- Refractory glass such as oven shells
- Light bulbs, energy saving lamps and fluorescent tubes
- Porcelain
- Flat glass such as windows and mirrors



Residual waste

What to throw in?

Residual waste that can't be separated for re-use. For example:

- Packs of baby food
- Coffee packs
- Chewing gum
- Wet and/or dirty paper and cardboard such as baking paper
- Used handkerchiefs, tissues, kitchen paper
- Diapers, sanitary napkins, tampons and incontinence materials
- Razor blades
- Aerosols (whipped cream, hairpin, deodorant)
- Vacuum cleaner bags and contents
- Bird sand
- Cat litter
- Hydro grains
- Plasticized paper, cardboard and pictures
- Loose-leaf binders, storage folders and ring binders
- Cork
- Filling material for cushions and stuffed animals
- Ash from the ashtray, fireplace and barbecue

What not?

- Breakstone
- Asbestos
- Chemical waste
- Large pieces of carpet, plastic and wood
